

DEATH OF MR. ALFRED EMBRY, OF CARDIFF.

With deep regret we announce the sudden death of Mr. Alfred Embry, of Cardiff, which took place under distressing circumstances on Sunday evening. Mr. Embry, at four o'clock in the afternoon, formed one of a christening party at Llanedarnae Church, where Mr. Sutton's youngest child and niece of the deceased was being baptised. The ceremony had just concluded, when he was seized with a fit of coughing, which resulted in the rupture of an important blood vessel, and he had to be conveyed home in a sinking condition. Dr. Edgar Jones, who arrived at Cross Farm in about an hour after the sad occurrence, was unremitting in his attention up to the time of his patient's death, which took place at 10.30 that evening. Mr. Embry, who had enjoyed the friendship of a large circle of friends in Cardiff and the neighbourhood, was a native of Monmouthshire, but had spent the greater portion of his life in the town of his adoption. Twenty-five years ago he accepted an appointment under the late Mr. Bland, who at that time was the local carting agent of the Great Western Railway. After Mr. Bland's death he became manager to Mr. Bond, who succeeded Mr. Bland, and he remained in that gentleman's employ up to the time of his death, which took place in 1889. Since then Mr. Embry has been in business as a general haulier on his own account, but continued to deliver the heavy goods for the Great Western Railway Company. He was a gentleman of a very genial temperament, and was held in high esteem by the Great Western Railway Company's officials at Cardiff, who with a large number of other persons will unite in deploring his death.
