7. Are you, or have you been, an Apprentice? If so, where? *Yes, at St. David's, Cardiff*
8. Are you Married? *No*
9. Have you ever been sentenced to Penal Servitude or Imprisonment by the Civil Power? *No*
10. Do you now belong to the Royal Navy, the Army, the Territorial Force, the Army Reserve, the Militia Reserve, or any Naval Reserve Force? If so, to what unit and Corps? *No*
11. Have you ever served in the Royal Navy, the Army, the Territorial Force, the Militia Reserve, the Special Reserve, the Territorial Force, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Volunteers, the Army Reserve, the Militia Reserve, or any Naval Reserve Force?
